West Kimberley Labour Hire has really ramped up with over 45 people in employment.

Congratulations to our trainee, Carly Fuller, for completing her traineeship and moving into a fulltime role in HR and Finance within the organisation. We've taken on a school based apprentice, D'Shinay Hudson. D'Shinay joins our Men's Shed doing a mechanical apprenticeship.

Winun Ngari is working with the Defense Force to take 20 students from DDHS to Perth in September to visit a number of Defense Force bases and universities. Keep an eye out in the coming months for more on this exciting venture.

Arts, I was Working for the Dole doing
screen printing which allowed me to learn
how to create designs and print them onto
materials such as shirts, bags and recently
face masks. I had been Working for the
Dole for 3 years, it was a good experience
creating all those designs and learning how
to sew bags. I made good relationships with
other people who also worked at and
supported me at Barooloo Arts.

I have now moved on to working at Main Roads in Derby. I started on a three month trial and it has been almost six months of working here. I am part of the Business Services team; I also help the Safety team by completing inductions for the Kimberley Region and I provide project support when required.

I have good variety in my job, this week I am helping to organise a lunch for NAIDOC week where we will eat croc burgers and kangaroo tail!"

OVER 300 KIMBERLEY WOMEN JOIN FOR TWO DAYS OF SHARING AND LEARNING ON COUNTRY

Women and girls from the Kimberley and beyond attended the Strong Women's Event at Birdwood Downs to take part in hands-on workshops, discussions, engage in creative spaces, storytelling, music, dance, fashion, film and food.

The two-day event offered a shared space for all women and girls across the Kimberley to build connections, learn new skills and create opportunities to work together.

We believe that women have the strength and capability to nurture positive change in their communities from the ground-up. We also understand the importance of coming together to share our stories, spark new ideas and take action.

We wanted to shine the light on girls and women who are thinkers, leaders and who give back to their community.

Winun Ngari Chief Executive Officer, Sonia Tait said the event was an important place for women to connect and talk, and providing somewhere safe for them to do so was integral to the event's success. "[It's important] to have the opportunity to create that [safe] space, and have the opportunity to bring women from all over the Kimberleys and further together," she said.

"It's also [an opportunity] to assist women in feeling comfortable enough to use their voice and share their experiences, and give those that aren't as confident, a little bit more exposure and to become a little bit more confident themselves.

"Usually a lot of us mob only catch up around sorry time, around funerals when someone's passed; it's very rare we have the opportunity to come together for something as positive and happy as this."



The purpose of the role is to deliver employment services as a primary point of contact for individual clients (job seekers) through their client journey from assessment, access to the system, job plan collation, mutual obligation monitoring, identification of employment opportunities and post placement support, coordinating relevant local support services in lifting barriers to employment, identifying professional client aspirations and upskilling clients to increase employability.

Winun Ngari Aboriginal Corporation Employment Services is a provider for remote Aboriginal communities in the West Kimberley. In addition to serving communities in and around Derby, we service remote communities located along the Gibb River Road, and Looma (including surrounding communities) including the town site of Derby.

Job Requirements:

Applicants should have relevant skills and/or experience in intermediate to advanced Microsoft Office skills (Word, Excel, Outlook), including the ability to process comprehensive information on computers and online platforms. Demonstrated customer service skills in empathy, problem solving and listening. Strong self-management skills in personal responsibility, stress management and time management.

NDIS Community Connector

Current employment vacancy for NDIS Community Connector

The purpose of the role is for the Community Connector to support people from culturally diverse backgrounds to access the NDIS in providing help by acting as a liaison person between the client and the NDIS.

Winun Ngari Aboriginal Corporation secured a contract with the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) to become a remote community connector, a hub for people to go to when they need NDIS related services. The National Disability Insurance Scheme is a scheme of the Australian Government that funds costs associated with disability.

Job Requirements:

The Community Connector will support clients to apply for the NDIS. Connect clients with the local NDIS contacts as well as provide support for clients to understand and use the NDIS services better.

The successful applicant must be able to submit the following documentation:

- Working with Children Check
- National Police Clearance
- Current Drivers Licence (desirable)
- Proof of Vaccination

Must also be able to pass a D&A test.

DIRECTOR IDENTIFICATION NUMBER (DIRECTOR ID)

ABOUT DIRECTOR ID

Anyone who wants to nominate or re-nominate to become a Director for Winun Ngari will now need to have a Director ID BEFORE the AGM on the 24th of November this year.

Directors will only ever have one Director ID (15-digit number) to keep forever even if you change corporations or companies, stop being a Director, change your name, move interstate or overseas.

Process to Get a Director ID

- ·There are three ways to get your Director ID
 - Create a myGovID (different from myGov)
 - Paper application
 - Over the telephone the easiest and quickest by calling 13 62 50

The identification you will need is:

- your tax file number (TFN) and residential address as held by the Australian Tax Office (ATO)
- answer 2 questions based on details known only to you and the government
- one primary and one secondary Australian identity document as per the table below:

Primary Documents x 1	Secondary Documents x 1
Australian full birth certificate (not extracts or commemorative certificates)	Medicare card
Australian passport (including passports that have expired in the past 3 years)	Australian driver's licence or learner's permit.
Australian citizenship certificate or extract from a Register of Citizenship by Descent
